# Operating within COVID-19 orders and guidelines

2021 was full of continuous adaptions -we learnt a lot about being flexible!

- ▶ January July 2021 slowly built-up program offerings with covid protocols
- > PHO order, mask mandates and standards of operations changed regularly
- Fine tuning processes and procedure to best fit the evolving health orders and community needs
- Temporary single admissions remained in place until July 15, 2021. Memberships and 10 passes back on sale in July.
- Summer 2021 ease in restrictions and opening up
  - July 15 Swim and Camp Programs reverted to pre-Covid "normal" capacity and with few Covid guidelines in place
  - Cleaning transitions and pre-booking lifted for leisure/public swim and Aquafit kept some prebooking - Fitness room, courts and lane swim
- Fall 2021 3<sup>rd</sup> wave restrictions
  - Mask order back in-place
  - BC Vaccine Passports order in place (until January 2022, then extended to June 2022 (but really ended in April 2022)
- December 2021 4<sup>th</sup> wave Omicron variant
  - Northern Health Circuit breaker(Fitness room closed until January 18, 2022): Adult Fitness programs and activities ceased.
  - ► Capacity limits back at 50% and returned to one way direction

# Staffing Shortage

- We have been challenged with staffing levels since 2019
- This is not uncommon in our community or recreation facilities across BC and has continued during the pandemic
- Staff and Board of Directors have been making changes each season as required. Being careful to consider facility usage and balancing community needs.
  - Reduced hours of operations and reduced program offering
  - Compact multi-use schedules
  - Management helping on the front line
  - Giving out overtime as required
  - Pre-closing on some long-weekend to allow for staff "breaks" incentive
- Lifeguard Training Program
- Wages and classification review and strategies

We had a total of 44 employees in 2021. 29 were new staff joining the team within the year

**>** 2019: 61

Prioritized wage reviews, and staying ahead of BC minimum wage increases. Goal to get our Part-time/ Full-time positions towards living wages (2019-2021)

part-time lifeguard(3): \$20.00 to \$25.09

casual lifeguard(2): \$18.50 to \$20.79

part-time front desk: \$18.00 to \$19.09

aquatic supervisors: \$23.00 to \$26.33

coordinators: \$23.80 to \$27.00

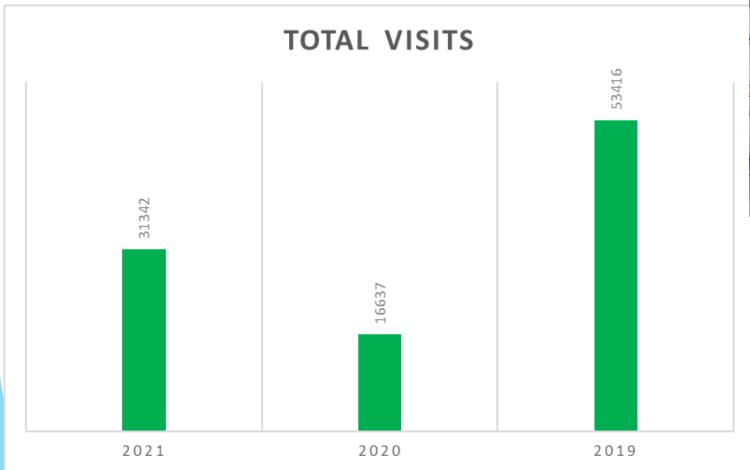

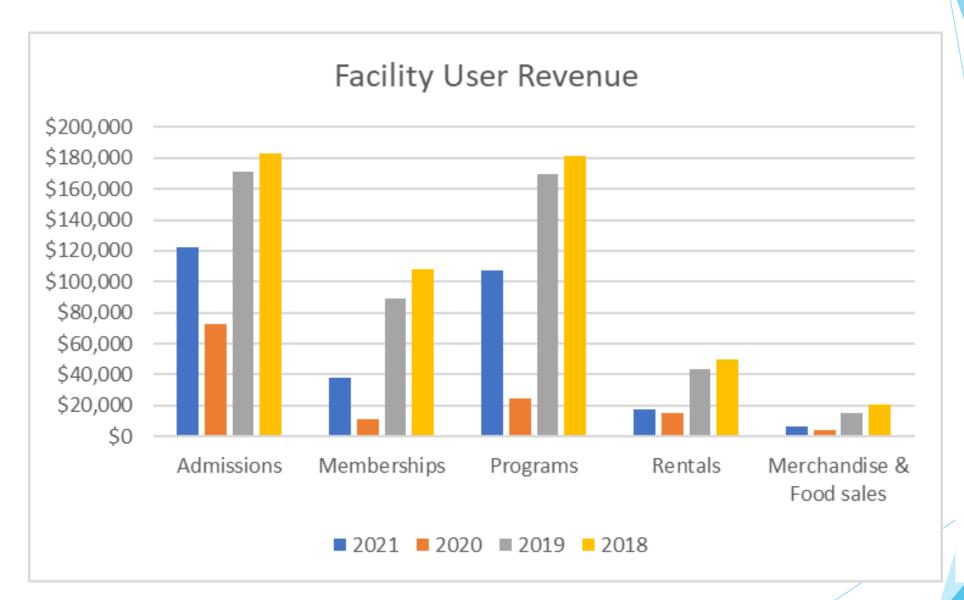

# 2021 Visit stats



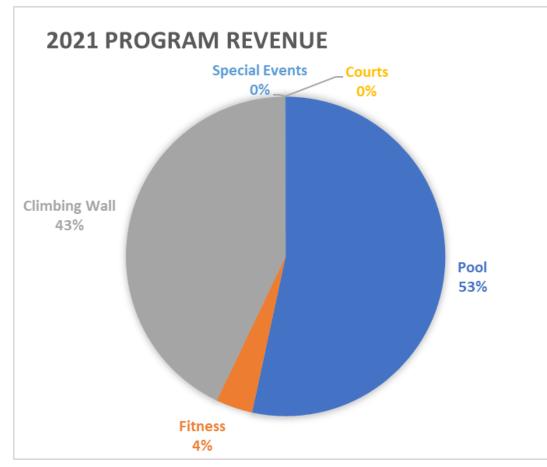






### IMPACT:

- Pool Programs BIG impact: low capacity while keeping distance requirements
- Parented lessons for young and low level swimming lessons - barrier to participate
- Kids Camp and Wall programs did well in 2021, indoor environment and ability to wear mask created success for these programs
- Fitness Programs: reduced class sizes and restrictions
- Special Events very limited during Covid

2021: Zero mechanical closures!

- Pool closures:
  - Main Pool September 21<sup>st</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> 20hrs (Diarrhea)
  - Main Pool and Hot Tub October 30<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> 24.5 hrs
- Had a number of functional facility closures due to staffing levels and our strict staff illness policies - the community is notified via email and social media posts
- Staff take great pride in our facility cleanliness and it shows!

# Facility Function & Program Study

### **Key outcomes**

- Phasing Project
  - Phase one is part of a bigger long-term project. Phasing allows for swift progress of smaller more manageable projects; fundraising and reduces facility disruption
- Fitness Facility
  - Access from across the natatorium and it is very small
  - Only accommodates a few people at the time.
  - Limited access for those with mobility challenges
- Administration & Lobby
  - Poor control points, aging casement, crowding
  - Existing administration areas do not satisfy the facility's needs inefficient
  - Lack of a meeting room and classroom is limiting
- Universal Access
  - Improve access to facilities for users of all abilities and orientation addressed in Phase 2
- Existing pool tank
  - The compromises of the original build limit use and function of the pool space. - addressed in Phase 2

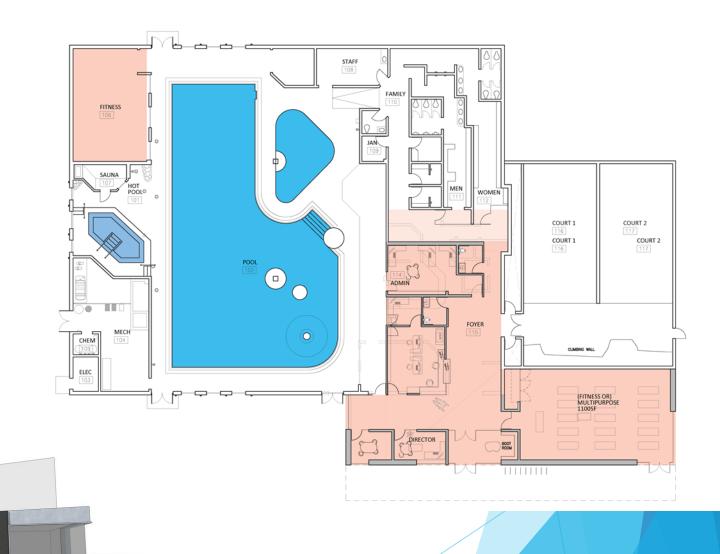
#### Addition to the front of the building

Conversion of the existing fitness studio into a multi-purpose space

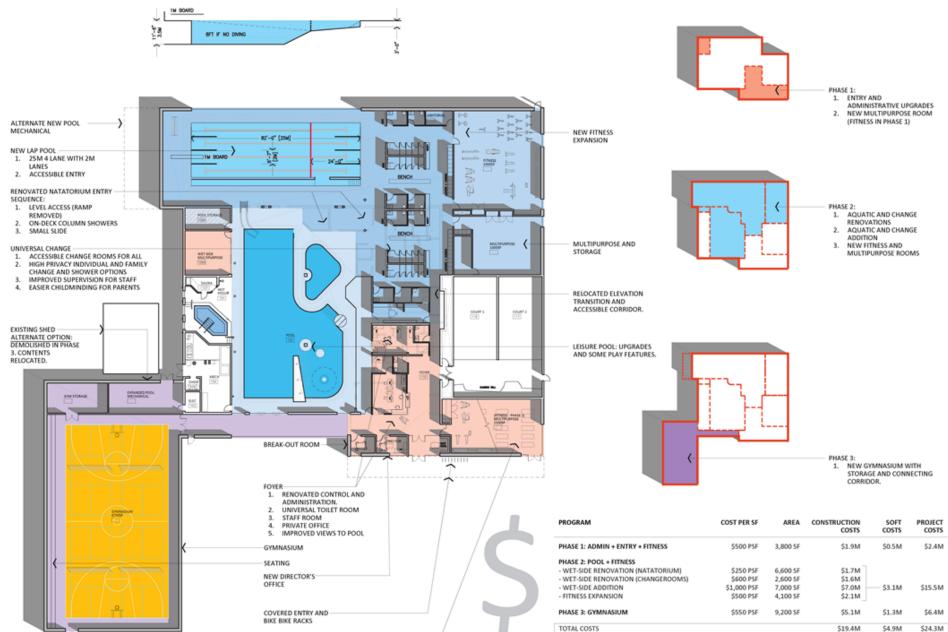
